Record of Proceedings
April 22, 2002

A meeting of the Board was called to order by the President, Cliff Mueller at 7:35 p.m. Present for the meeting Cliff Mueller, Bonita Hutcheson, Roger Rowland, Bill Carter. Also present Eddie Kanoza, Rowena Yarbrough, Jean Moore, and Charlotte Herman.

Treasurer report: The treasurer, Chuck West, was absent, so there was no treasurer's report.

Minutes: The minutes of March 25, 2002 were approved as corrected: Bill Carter paid his dues.

Fabian Building: The Fabian Building was the one that set on the site of the new High School. In the November 1996 minutes it was discussed along with a drawing of it. All members requested a copy. Copies were distributed. See exhibit A.

Deaths: Joe Sviegel, *Sviegel Auto and Parts*, 76, passed away. He was a long time resident of Sheridan, along South Santa Fe Blvd, in Petersburg.

Chauncey Dunn, 97, passed away. He owned the *South Park for Mobile Homes* for many years.

Copies of the obituaries were included with the minutes when they were mailed, and distributed to the email members. Roger Rowland would like to list all those residents who have passed away, and will meet with Bonita Hutcheson to review the permanent files of Sheridan Historical for that information.

Walking Tour: Places listed for the walking tour, the Fort Logan train platform, the station location, the Grand Hotel location, Greene's Grocery Store [which later was the Post Office, and is now a residence], the South Park, Southern Pacific railroad station site, the stone house on S. King, and of course Monaghans' Tavern. The committee was sure there were other sites, and photos are available for some of these locations and buildings.

Booklet: Theme is "The Little City that Did", and we could do a history of the Parks in Sheridan, since we will now be holding the celebration at **Barnes Park**. Other parks named for inclusion **Nesbitt Park, Chase Park, Alice Terry Park, Sheridan Community Park**, and a new one in the planning stage.

Other ideas for booklet: the 1930 census is now available for the public. The census information over the years would help in our history. Earl McCoy was suggested as a person who might assist us in obtaining this census information.

The next meeting will be May 20, 2002, because our regular day is Memorial Day, a national holiday.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
