



**Sheridan Historical Society
Trustee Meeting
Tuesday at 5:30 PM
March 24, 2026**

Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by Dallas in the “River Point” community room in the Sheridan Municipal Center at 4101 S. Federal Boulevard at 5:25 pm.

The following board members were present: Dallas Hall, Andrew Rogge, and Roger Rowland. Board member Ernie Camacho was excused from the meeting. Guests included new society member Roy Ladewig and Annette Ivey.

Roy mentioned he is interested in the history of the area and particularly Fort Logan National Cemetery. He is working on a project about significant persons buried in the cemetery. Annette expressed her interest in a historical preservation ordinance for the city.

A motion was made by Dallas and seconded by Andrew to approve the minutes of January 27, 2026. The motion was approved.

Treasurer’s Report

The current balance is \$4,951.87. A motion was made by Andrew and seconded by Dallas to accept the report. The motion passed. Annette Ivey paid membership dues of \$10.00.

Correspondence

There was no correspondence.

Old Business

The Supplement History of the Sheridan Police Department is still in progress. The original history covered from 1960 to 2005. The only remaining items needed for completion for the supplemental history are pictures from the police department. This includes pictures of badges, police patch, and commissioned officers.

Roger made a presentation to the school board about a proposed “history room” in the relocated school district administration area (in the old high school east wing). This was presented at the school board meeting of February 24, 2026. A copy of the presentation was given to the historical society board. It noted the non-existence of any historical museum in Sheridan and the

city did not have any facility available. The idea of a history room had already been discussed within the school district. Roger proposed a small area in the room for an office for the historical society for a nominal monthly rental. The society could help organize and manage the room. The room could display historical items for the city, school district, and the community.

Website updates include a couple of short biographies. Edmund Klocker served as the school board president from 1981 to 1991. Ed passed away unexpectedly in 1991. Linda Jenner was a business and accounting teacher at Sheridan High School from 1977 through 2005. She passed away last year. Copies of both biographies were presented to the board.

Roger noted that an audio interview with Clark Bond had been uploaded to the website. The interview was in 2017 and lasts about fifty-four (54) minutes. Clark grew up in the Petersburg area of Sheridan, attended Sheridan Union High School, and came back to be a teacher and assistant principal. He later was the principal of the Middle School and Fort Logan Elementary School. Clark passed away 2021.

New Business

New school district administrators include Chief Financial Officer Prindle Feese. Prindle was previously a CFO for a small school district near Louisville, Kentucky. Raymond Montoya has been promoted to the position of Operations Director for the school district.

It was a consensus for the society to obtain a booth in the Sheridan Celebrates activity in September. The fee is anticipated to be \$25.00. (The actual fee is \$20.00, if submitted before September 4, 2026.)

Annette Ivey expressed interest in becoming a member of the board. A motion was made by Dallas and second by Andrew to appoint Annette to the board. The motion was approved and Annette was welcomed to the board. The board is now composed of five members.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:52 pm.
